

How to clear your browser cache

Chrome

1. At the top right, click More (or the line of three vertical dots).
2. Click "More tools" and then "Clear browsing data."
3. At the top, choose a time range. To delete everything, select "All time."
4. Next to "Cookies and other site data" and "Cached images and files," check the boxes.
5. Click Clear data.

Microsoft Edge

1. Select "Settings and more" > "Settings" > "Privacy and services."
2. Under "Clear browsing data," select "Choose what to clear."
3. Choose a time range from the Time range drop-down menu.
4. Choose the types of data you want to clear. For example, you may want to remove browsing history and cookies but keep passwords and form fill data.
5. Select "Clear now."

Firefox

1. Click the Menu button (three vertical lines)
2. Select the "Privacy & Security" panel.
3. In the "Cookies and Site Data" section, click "Clear Data"
4. Remove the check mark in front of "Cookies and Site Data."
5. With "Cached Web Content" check marked, click the "Clear" button.

Internet Explorer 11

1. Press the [Ctrl], [Shift] and [Del] Keys, together.
2. Remove all checks except the selection for "Temporary Internet files and website files."
3. Click "Delete" to clear the cache.
4. Reload the webpage.

Safari

1. Choose History > Clear History, then click the pop-up menu.
2. Choose how far back you want your browsing history cleared.

iOS

1. Tap the "Settings" icon
2. Scroll to Safari
3. Scroll to "Clear history and website data" and tap "Clear History and Data"

Android

1. On your Android phone or tablet, open the Chrome app.
2. At the top right, tap "More."
3. Tap "History" > "Clear browsing data."
4. At the top, choose a time range. (To delete everything, select All time).
5. Check the boxes for "Cookies and site data" and "Cached images and files."
6. Tap "Clear data."
